--The 7th tradition collected for GSO was 7.3 million dollars- and \$165,000 was the net income from the Grapevine Magazine

--4,900 Big Books are shipped from GSO on a daily basis.

--In Literature, the text about young peoples conferences be added to the pamphlet "Young People In AA" : that the AA Group pamphlet be revised to include text from the service piece "Safety and AA: Our Common Welfare; and that the trustees Literature Committee develop language regarding safety for current and new recovery literature, where appropriate.
