FOUR STAGES OF THE 12-STEPS

- 1-3 *Giving it up*
- 4-6 *Fessing it up*
- 7-9 *Cleaning it up*
- 10-12 *Living it up*

Steps One thru Three:

Giving it up:

The cliché “*Meeting makers make it*” can be helpful—*sort of*. Group sharing, early on, helped me to solidify that I was really an alcoholic (Step One), and that a spiritual power, “greater than myself,” could restore my sanity, consequently, I would never again have to wake up in another drunk tank (Step Two); also, those many meetings made clear that I needed to ask God for help, *el pronto* (Step Three). Yet I was told that “*Survival on the fellowship was untreated alcoholism,*” I was also told that although meeting makers may make it to lots of meetings, and learn important and hopeful facts, it was not my solution. This process was only a *beginning*—many alxies who stopped at this point got drunk! Certain of the less sensitive refer to this as: “1-2-3 Cha-Cha-cha (not recommended).”

Steps Four Thru Six: *Fessing it up:*

My sponsor pointed out, just after we prayed the Third Step prayer together, that all my new-found spiritual gusto would soon fade away unless we begin Step Four *at once* (p. 64). After a short period of spontaneous God-inspired writing, followed by my own reflections, I then had enough honest information to allow my sponsor to take me through the Fourth Step Process. Step Five was done at *first opportunity* (p. 74), which started only a few minutes later. Now, being armed with those defects and shortcomings that constituted that bondage of self I confessed to myself that I had to become willing to have them removed (Step Six).

Steps Seven Thru Nine: *Cleaning it up:*

I then asked God to remove these suddenly revealed destructive facets in Step Seven, then reviewed and added to my mostly written Step Eight list. After a conference with my sponsor, and prayers to God, I began making my Step Nine amends as suggested in the Big Book.

Steps Ten thru Twelve: *Living it up:*

I have learned that the above nine steps were only a teaching-of-the-heart *event*. Steps Ten, Eleven and Twelve, are a lifelong *process*. Living these last three steps is a continuous re-doing (living) of the first nine! Life is easier, and much happier now—I have begun the process of *living it up!*

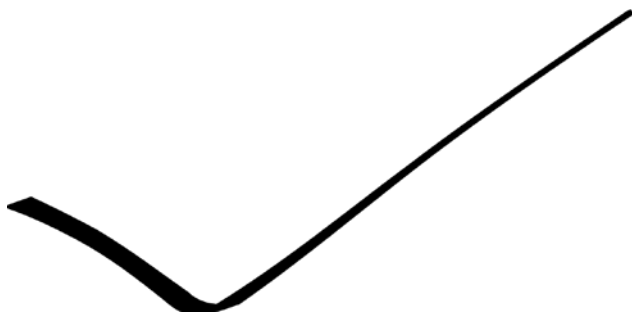
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Tradition Three ✓ Checklist

Tradition Three: *The only requirement for AA membership is a desire to stop drinking.*

1. In my mind, do I prejudge some new AA members as losers?
2. Is there some kind of alcoholic whom I privately do not want in my AA group?
3. Do I set myself up as a judge of whether a newcomer is sincere or phony?
4. Do I let language, religion (or lack of it), race, education, age, or other such things interfere with my carrying the message?
5. Am I over impressed by a celebrity, a doctor, a clergyman, an ex-convict? Or can I just treat this new member simply and naturally as one more sick human, like the rest of us?
6. When someone turns up at AA needing information or help (even if he can't ask for it aloud), does it really matter to me what he does for a living? Where he lives? What his domestic arrangements are? Whether he had been to AA before? What his other problems are?



Concept Three ✓ Checklist

Concept III: *To insure effective leadership, we should endow each element of A.A. – the Conference, the General Service Board and its service corporations, staffs, committees, and executives – with a traditional “Right of Decision.”*

1. Do we understand what is meant by the “Right of Decision”? Do we grant it at all levels of service or do we “instruct”?
2. Do we trust our trusted servants – G.S.R, D.C.M, area delegate, the Conference itself?

Tradition Three

The third tradition clearly states that the only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking. Alcoholic anonymous may not refuse membership based on race, sexual orientation, social standing or religious beliefs, nor may A.A. membership depend on money or conformity. Any group of drunks may gather and call themselves A.A., unless the group has other affiliations. Alcohols anonymous has always thrived based on the fact we are both a democracy and the benign anarchist that membership ought to included ALL that suffer from alcoholism. Whom amongst us would listen to rules of the bourgeoisie or the even the clamors of the proletariat? We must never deny any alcoholic no matter how sick, the proven way-out, we must let the alcoholic know they are in fact entitled to the same bad cup of coffee, and over used saying that we were. No individual can harm the group as a whole, we are not afraid, no matter how twisted we may be. We should be able to do this at the time we meet the newcomer, through our basic principles and our code of love a tolerance. The responsible prayer teaches us that we want the hand of A.A. to be there when anyone anywhere reaches out. Remember the highest position ever in A.A is servant.

March - Concept 3

As a traditional means of creating and maintaining a clearly defined working relation between the groups, the Conference, the A.A. General Service Board and its several service corporations, staffs, committees and executives, and of thus insuring their effective leadership, it is here suggested that we endow each of these elements of world service with a traditional “Right of Decision.” (long form)

This concept focuses on the “Right of Decision.” It is so very important that the Fellowship has trust in its trusted servants. There are often times in service meetings when delegates need to use their best judgment and follow their own conscious. Groups should take this into consideration when electing delegates.

Although groups do not instruct their delegates, the delegate still needs to adequately report or consult with the group before making important decisions.



2017 Salt River Intergroup Financial Analysis

Hi fellow spirit travelers! My name is Aaron B and I have had the honor and privilege of serving as your Salt River Intergroup Treasurer. I would like to start by simply thanking all of the groups and individuals that participate and contribute to the Salt River Intergroup on all levels. We are here to serve you in an effort to reach the still suffering alcoholic and help our members live a contented daily sober life. 2017 has been a great year and we have made many accomplishments which I would like to relay to you.

- Group Contributions +5%
The annual budget was anticipated to be \$73,000 and the actual \$80,172
- Individual Contributions +245%
This increase included a large donation from one individual which we are very grateful for. Just to give perspective, if we were to remove that amount we would still see an increase of 46%.
- Store Income -10%
The decrease in store income has multiple factors. Mainly from an increased cost of our meeting lists, AA literature and Grapevine literature. We absorbed these cost increases without increasing our cost to the member or groups. We also saw a reduction in meeting list sales primarily because H&I did not purchase as many in previous years.
- Other Income +60%
This includes any profit/loss from the Anniversary, SRI Alcathon, and New Years Eve events; 7th tradition, filing cabinet, etc.

The main increase came from recording the income from the New Years Eve event and did not have any expense because the event did not take place as voted on by the groups.

- Roundup Income +12%
Last year we moved to a new venue and did incur some unexpected costs that were beyond our control. We did however make more profit than 2016 with nearly 1300 people in attendance and an increase of at door registrations and banquet tickets. On that note we will be having this year's Roundup at the Point Hilton Tapatio Cliffs which will provide a much better meeting space for everyone and anticipate it to be an experience you won't want to miss.
- Expenses 0% change
We did not exceed our budgeted expenses for 2017
- Net Profit +43%
The major increase was a result of increased Group and Individual contributions throughout the year

Please encourage your groups and members to purchase your chips, meeting supplies, literature, etc. from central office. If there is any way we can better serve you please let your intergroup rep know and if your home group doesn't have one.....It's time. We welcome all to have a voice in what we do.

In conclusion:

With the additional income we were able to install a new air conditioner that was long overdue and will be more efficient and cost effective without exceeding our expense budget.

About seven years ago we had to relocate our office and incurred some major expenses in doing so. Funds were used from our prudent reserve to make the move, build a restroom to be compliant with city code, and make the space operable. Because of the increase in contributions we were also able to bring our prudent reserve back up to four months of operating expenses in accordance to our bylaws still without exceeding our expense budget.

The steering committee, central office, and the entire AA community owe you all a great deal of gratitude for making this possible. We strive to do our best to serve you to the best of our ability and to adhere to our primary purpose, to help the still suffering alcoholic.

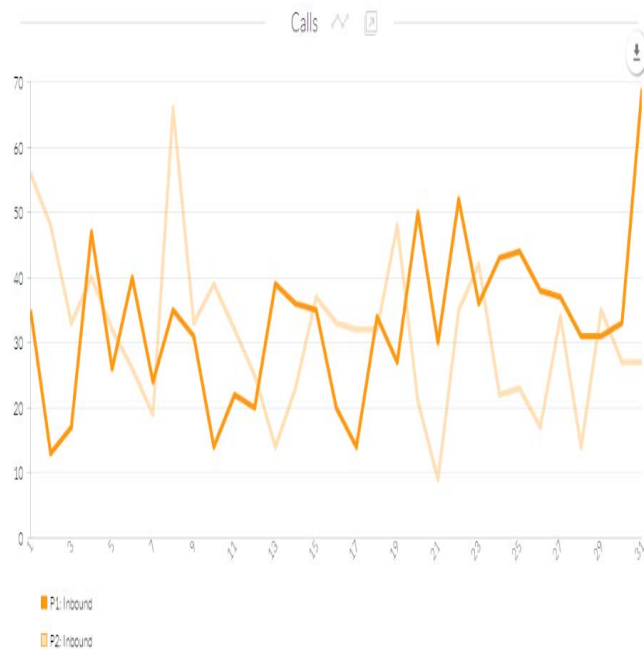
