Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or AA as a whole.

Who is familiar with the Grapevine book *Our Twelve Traditions*? This book is published by the Grapevine and includes letters from AA members related to each of the traditions. A handful of years ago, I chaired a Traditions meeting and because I had such little knowledge, I purchased this book and used its stories to help guide the discussion at each meeting. The longer I chaired that meeting, the less I found it necessary to guide the discussions. I still enjoy this book though.

The introduction for Tradition Four helps set the tone for this writing. “There are all kinds of AA groups – big groups, little groups, offbeat groups. Groups that welcome beginners with coffee and cookies, groups that prefer a warm handshake and a smile before the meeting begins, saving refreshments for later.”

Each meeting we attend has its own personality. A meeting can be its own group or can be just one meeting for a larger group. I have had a homegroup that itself had over 40 meetings a week and I have also had a homegroup with 1 meeting a week. Each of those groups has their own ways, their own history and personality. What is the same between them is they are both AA groups and use the group conscience to guide how the group makes and carries out decisions.

Each group can be what it chooses to be. If the members want to make the group change, all it takes is agreement. Groups are born and die off based on everyone’s power of choice, the ability to make a decision for themselves.

The second part of this tradition is the responsibility that comes with choice. It is our responsibility to make decisions for ourselves but not decisions that affect other groups or AA as a whole. What does that mean? That means that groups need to be thoughtful about how their decisions affect others. If the decision could affect others, then those others need to be part of the discussion and decision.

I look at the traditions as guidance for me as part of a larger group. So for me, I see Tradition Four as clearly offering me the ability to make decisions for myself but not for any one else. I am autonomous, and so is everyone else. And with that autonomy comes a responsibility to be aware of how my choices will affect those around me.

“These Twelve Concepts therefore represent an attempt to put on paper the why of our service structure in such a fashion that the highly valuable experience of the past and the conclusions that we have drawn from it cannot be lost” – Bill W. 10th General Service Conference -1960 New York, New York.

“Throughout our Conference structure, we ought to maintain at all responsible levels a traditional “Right of Participation,” taking care that each classification or group of our world servants shall be allowed a voting representation in reasonable proportion of the responsibility they each must discharge.”

According to Bill W., *“the preservation of the principle of ‘Participation’ in our service structure is...a matter of highest importance to our future.”* In its early days, the AA headquarters was run on authoritarian and institutional lines. At the time the trustees saw no reason to delegate their managerial power or to work in voting participation with any others outside their own body. The result was often dis-

harmony and misunderstanding, and it was out of this rough going that the principle of "Participation" finally emerged. Bill cautions against the possibility of new delegates or trustees trying to 'weaken, modify or toss out" the "Right of Participation."

All of us deeply desire to belong. It is our shining ideal that the "spiritual corporation" of AA should never include any members who are regarded as "second class." The "Right of Participation" therefore reinforces Tradition Two, which no member is placed in "ultimate authority" over another. Moreover, when we are sure we belong, we tend to perform our service tasks better. Thus, the fact of our participation assures us we are truly the "trusted servants" as described in Tradition Two.

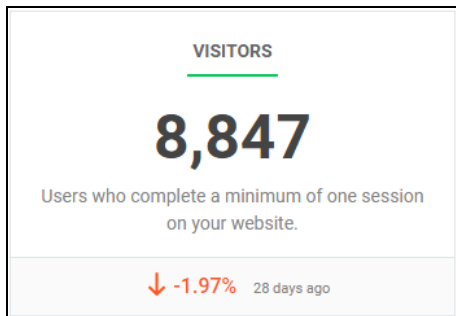

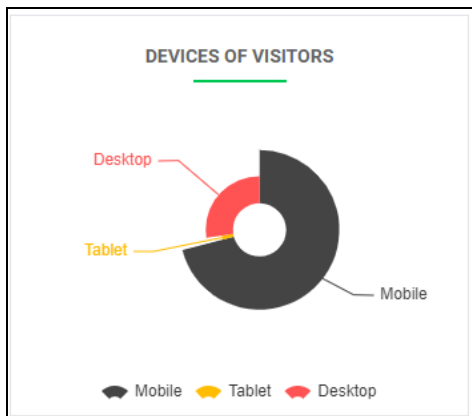

We give out newcomer packets with a plethora of names and phone numbers on the envelope.

HIGHLIGHT ANYTHING EXCITING ABOUT YOUR MEETING:

Our reading theme is different for each day of the week. One person starts by reading a paragraph or two and then can share for a minute or two what has been read or they can simply pass to the left for more readers. As the reading goes around the room from person to person there becomes more of an opportunity for the current reader to share for a couple minutes anything that has already been read.

On the last meeting of the month, we celebrate AA anniversaries with a cake, and a speaker. The longevity of sobriety is phenomenal with members in very early sobriety going all the way up into the 40s and 50s milestone count. The willingness to rally around the newcomer is such a beautiful space to be involved with.

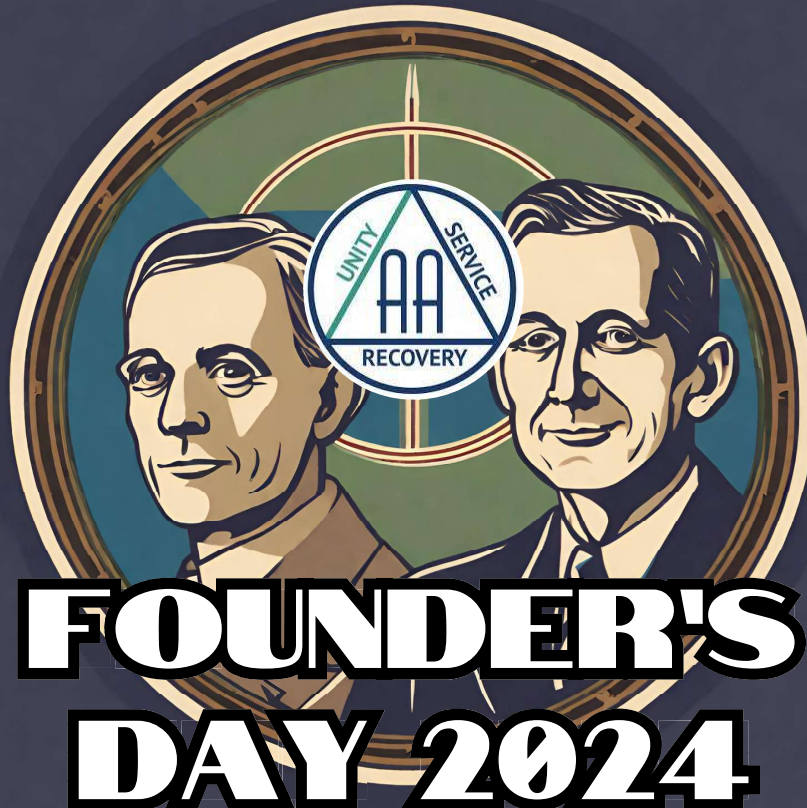

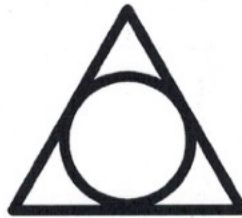
