Tradition 2

For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority, a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern.

As a member of Alcoholics Anonymous, I love Bill W's description of our organization as a democracy, and "a benign anarchy." That fits the wide range of opinions and the natural rebellious nature I see among my fellows. I don't know about you, but when I came in, I absolutely dug in my heels and resisted anyone who said I should do anything on their timeline or in their way. By electing our officers and those who hold service positions in each home group, and by continuing to rotate positions regularly so that everyone shoulders part of the burden, we stay fresh.

If we want to, our group can elect to be a part of the whole AA service structure by electing a general service representative (GSR) to attend local meetings and send a delegate to the annual General Service Conference. The Conference produces opinions on important matters of policy, and approves the choice of some trustee nominees for the General Service Board and elects others. Neither the Conference nor the Board can give orders to any group or member.

We are united in our home group by our desire to continue to grow, spiritually, and the "ultimate authority" is the spiritual concept of the "group conscience." The majority may be clear from a vote, but minority ideas are given thoughtful attention, and sometimes votes change. This tradition gives our Higher Power, as we each understand It, a voice to be heard in our meetings and gives us a mechanism for making decisions that can reconcile our many points of view. It also gives me trust that the group spirit of AA that I felt so strongly in my first meetings, continues to welcome us in and bind us together.

Tradition Checklist

- Do I participate in discussing and arriving at our group's conscience?
- Do I accept the decisions of the majority? Or do I continue to lobby for my own way after the group has spoken?
- Have I ever changed a vote after listening to someone state their minority opinion?

Concept 2

II. The General Service Conference of A.A. has become, for nearly every practical purpose, the active voice and the effective conscience of our whole society in its world affairs.

The Second Concept helps me understand how AA stays unified and grounded without having anyone "in charge." While AA is made up of thousands of independent groups, this Concept explains that the General Service Conference functions as a practical way for the collective conscience of the fellowship to be expressed. It isn't a governing body in the usual sense; rather, it's how AA listens to itself when decisions need to be made about matters that affect us as a whole.

What stands out to me is that the Conference isn't meant to replace the groups or speak *over* them. Instead, it exists because the groups have chosen to entrust their shared voice to a representative process. That trust allows AA to act thoughtfully and consistently in world affairs—publishing literature, safeguarding our message, and responding to new challenges—without sacrificing the independence that makes AA work at the local level.

At a deeper level, the Second Concept feels like an expression of maturity in the fellowship. It acknowledges that spiritual principles alone aren't enough; they need a responsible, conscience-driven structure to carry them into action. The Conference becomes effective not because it holds authority, but because it reflects the informed, collective conscience of AA—an ongoing effort to balance unity, humility, and accountability in service of the primary purpose.
