From Your Steering Committee

Tradition Seven

Every A.A. Group ought to be fully selfsupporting, declining outside contributions.

There are well-defined, valuable suggestions for how groups can take in and disperse funds to support themselves and to carry the message of Alcoholics Anonymous as they see fit. [See Suggested Readings]

But how can the Seventh Tradition benefit us personally?

Responsibility. As active alcoholics we were takers. We put our needs before the needs of others, especially our loved ones. How many times did I hold money back for a drink, or spend lavishly drinking with my friends, only to find, in the light of day, that my bills or my family's needs could not be met? How many times did I beg, borrow or steal for a drink? "Selfishness—self-centeredness! That, we think, is the root of our troubles." Giving whatever we can to a basket or can at each meeting slowly, but surely, helps us pay our own way. It allows us to feel a sense of worth, to be able to say "I am responsible". This is the principle of Tradition Seven.

<u>Integrity</u>. As active alcoholics we were amoral at best. Too often, our behaviors did not match our values. How many times did I betray my own truths in order to drink? Lies, justifications, self-deceit. When we come to AA, we hear "do the next right thing". What does this mean? It means that if we wish to regain a

moral compass, to restore trust in ourselves, we must repeat actions that match our values. We value what our AA group does for us. We do not wish to see issues of money, property, or outside enterprises interfere. So, we contribute to the group because it is the right thing to do.

<u>Gratitude</u>. As active alcoholics we felt the world owed us – sympathy, money, opportunity, respect, etc. We were always unsatisfied. How many times did I drink at not getting something I thought I deserved? The simple act of contributing to that which is helping us (and others) stay sober can, in time, reverse this attitude and give us a sense of spiritual satisfaction. We begin to realize that we are blessed with something far greater than money can buy. Thus, our financial support becomes an outward expression of a deep inner gratitude.

Tradition Seven Checklist

Every AA group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.

- Honestly now, do I do all I can to help AA (my group, my central office, my GSO) remain self-supporting? Could I put a little more into the basket on behalf of the new guy who can't afford it yet? How generous was I when tanked in a barroom?
- Should the Grapevine sell advertising space to book publishers and drug companies, so it could make a big profit and become a bigger magazine, in full color, at a cheaper price per copy?
- If GSO runs short of funds some year, wouldn't it be okay to let the government subsidize AA groups in hospitals and prisons?
- Is it more important to get a big AA collection from a few people, or a smaller collection in which more members participate?
- Is a treasurer's report unimportant AA business? How does the treasurer feel about it?
- How important in my recovery is the feeling of self-respect, rather than the feeling of being always obligation for charity received?



Concept Seven

The Conference recognizes that the Charter and the Bylaws of the General Service Board are legal instruments: that the Trustees are thereby fully empowered to manage and conduct all of the world service affairs of Alcoholics Anonymous. It is further understood that the Conference Charter itself is not a legal document: that it relies instead upon the force of tradition and the power of the A.A. purse for it's final effectiveness.

This concept may appear to be contradictory; it may look like the collision of an irresistible force with an immovable object. On the one hand we see a Board of Trustees which is invested with complete legal power over A.A.'s funds and services, while on the other hand we find that A.A.'s General Service Conference is clothed with such great traditional influence and financial power that, if necessary, it could overcome the legal rights of the Board of Trustees. It can therefor give the Trustees directives and secure compliance with them-practically speaking.

A number of ideas and concepts were thought of to maintain a balance between the Conference, the Delegates who represent all areas and the Board of Trustees, which is made up of alcoholics and nonalcoholics were abandoned. So a Conference Charter was developed which gives Conference a final and ultimate authority and legally preserves the right of the Trustees to operate like any other business board of directors. Now there is balance maintaining "group conscience" conforming with Traditions one is protected by tradition and the other by law.

Steering Committee Member Spotlight

Bewildered

Occasionally I have cause to reflect on what has been a 39-year, wonderful journey as a member of Alcoholics Anonymous. Having 20 years of continuous sobriety currently, sometimes I am privileged to share one of the tipping points that enabled me to move out of recurrent periodic sobriety. One of those I will share with you.

From 1984 to 2003, I participated (meetings and service), read, had sponsors, made nice acquaintances, and took the steps with reservations of which I wasn't even aware. I had the feeling of A.A. being a thing I went to, instead of belonging to. Then, totally blind-sided, I would find myself after years or sometimes months of not drinking, demolished by alcohol once again. This was repeated periodically over 19 years. I thought maybe I was constitutionally incapable of being honest with myself, an unfortunate one. Was I a could not, or a would not? I gave up that debate and realized I was a did not. I was bewildered.

Then, a man appeared in my life through a set of random circumstances who seemed to look through me like glass after we had a couple of talks. He explained that the merciless obsession which periodically returned was because I would not fundamentally change my perception of life, you, me, and God because I thought my life was manageable if I was not drinking. The power I believed in was my own desire to not drink anymore. So, at certain times the obsession would return. Having no effective mental defense against the first drink, off to oblivion and misery I went, again.

He explained that I had described my having had much activity, but little well placed constructive action. Unmanageability while not drinking was something I had not even considered as part of the first step. Based on our talks, he expressed that I had never been consciously introduced to me, the good and the bad. I knew I had done good and bad things, but he meant my inner assets and liabilities.

Upon completion of step one, I told him I did not think I was going

to make it as I knew steps two and three were next. There is no hope in step one, and I felt doomed and horrified at what lay ahead.

He suggested I revisit my spiritual concepts so I could take steps two and three. He pointed out Ebby's talk with Bill W and that maybe I should revisit Bill's initial aversion to God and again read the chapter to the agnostics. He re-affirmed that there was more than ample evidence of A.A. members having significant sobriety who drank like me, and I did not doubt that. It could be done. I had witnessed it firsthand for nearly two decades. He restated the need for a spiritual awakening which I had never had sufficiently enough to remove the obsession.

He then made a suggestion, which I followed, that changed everything for me. At the time, I saw it as a "ridiculous" exercise, but I had already decided to do what my sponsor suggested. That was the limit of my willingness. He told me he did not know where I was going to find the God of my understanding, but I better leave no rock unturned. He said, "go home and write an ad for God just like you were going to put it in the paper." I thought, whatever!

Later that night in the solace of my room, I wrote: "GOD SEEKER" – "Desperate man seeking God, if you exist, I only ask you reveal yourself to me in a way I can understand, life and death matter, no impostors please." I asked only for conscious contact, no problems to be solved.

Well, what I thought was a ridiculous exercise, provided my flimsy reed. That exercise created just enough open mindedness in me to learn to seek (action) spiritual solutions to life's problems.

I have not had the obsession return for 20 years. I have a God of my understanding. I have anchorage to permanent values I am comfortable with. I still learn spiritual lessons more reluctantly than I would like to, but man am I grateful for my sobriety, the healing that has taken place and the opportunities that lie ahead.
