From Your Steering Committee

Tradition Six

An AA group ought never endorse, finance or lend the AA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.

Entanglements. The behavioral, emotional and financial wreckage of our past. We of AA work our 4th through 10th Steps to free ourselves from them. So why, as a group, would we want to engage in the same behaviors that might awaken in us the character defects from which we seek freedom?

Money, property and prestige. Economic security and respect can be good goals. But money, property and prestige can too often play second-fiddle to cunning, baffling and powerful in the hands of alcoholics. We believe we know the right way to achieve goals, sometimes with genuine intent to improve AA. And many of us can put up a mean fight or take a stubborn stance to prove this. This is one reason our founders suggested we stay out of any association between Alcoholics Anonymous and that which is NOT Alcoholics Anonymous.

Another reason is that our experience has qualified us, as alcoholics, to do one thing well. "The core of our AA procedure," says Bill W., 'is one alcoholic talking with another, whether that be sitting on a curb, in a home, or

at a meeting. It's the message, not the place; it's the talk, not the alms. That does our work." So why allow outside affiliations, money to burn, group success or arguments over leadership distract us from the main reason for our existence?

Finally, our Twelve Traditions end with the reminder "to place principles before personalities." A common goal worth having for the good of all in our Fellowship. Some of us have leadership skills; most of us are always right; and all of us have control issues of one sort or another. When we try to "run" AA, or involve our group in outside enterprises, we invariably "step on the toes of our fellows and they retaliate." When, however, we focus our actions, personal and group, on our message of hope, not the mess of entanglements, we are more likely to see the Twelve Step principles at work in all our affairs.

Question: Why is it important that we not get involved in outside enterprises?

Some alcoholics will stay around AA only if we have a TV and card room. If this is what is required to carry the message to them, should we have these facilities?

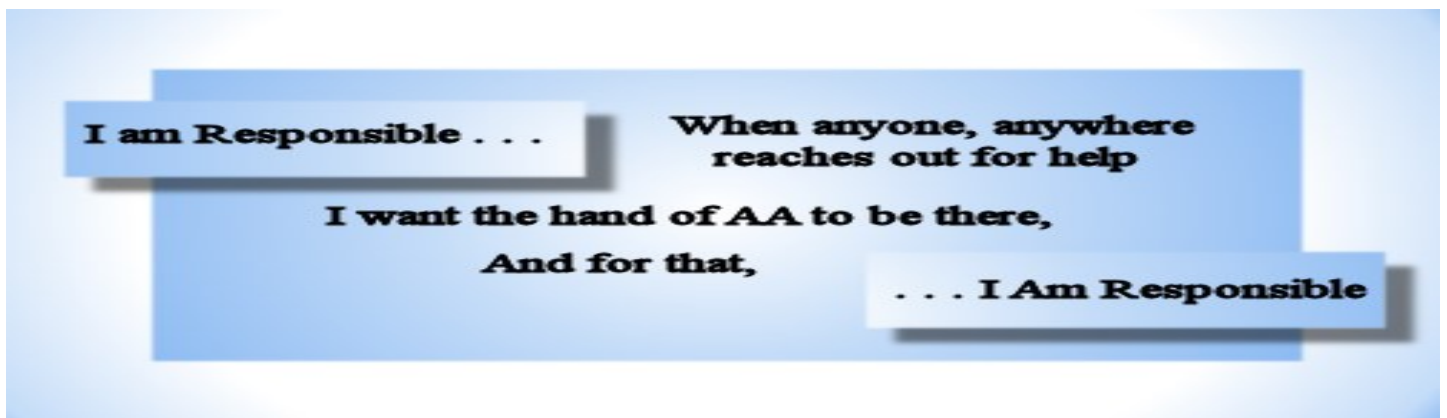


Concept Six

“On behalf of A.A. as a whole, our General Service Conference has the principal responsibility for the maintenance of our world services, and it traditionally has the final decision respecting large matters of general policy and finance. But the Conference also recognizes that the chief initiative and the active responsibility in most of these matters should be exercised primarily by the Trustee members of the Conference when they act among themselves as the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous.”

The General Service Board must delegate administrative authority to the board of trustees to carry out important tasks for the fellowship as a whole.

Steering Committee Member Spotlight

Step 6 Ready, Willing and Able

Step 6 is a lifetime of effort generally realized in millimeters and inches. Yet before we know it, we accomplish that which we didn't realize possible.

6. Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character

When I came into the rooms of AA, I had no spiritual 'anything'. I was completely bereft. I have since learned the importance of our spiritual growth especially when it comes to our character defects. Step 6 is the step I am continually exploring and putting forth effort. Well, actually, I must put forth effort continually on all the steps every day. Yet, step 6 requires more of my attention on a regular basis. Because my character defects have been with me for some time now, I don't always see them as defects. When they arise, and it's frequently, I think, 'well, that's the way I've always done it or that's who I am'. These patterns are 'hard wired' or what I call 'rutted'. In a sense, step 6 is an echo of steps 1, 2 & 3. It is this, the absolute inability to change ourselves on the deep, unconscious level, that gives us a whole new sense of surrender when we begin our work. It's beyond difficult to change these patterns on our own. In the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous, it suggests that our spiritual experience is about unlocking an inner resource that has always existed within us. This is something we need to keep in mind as we work the step. We realize it is time to let go of our defects of character because we can now see how the practice of these defects fed our alcoholism (addiction).

We grow into the willful suspension of our old beliefs making room for the new.

Step 6 is not about perfection but rather about willingness to live life fully with healthy and meaningful intent. Through the 12 steps there is a true road map to a way of becoming the person we truly aspire to be. Focus on that vision and let it expand. As the vision of who we really want to be beckons us, we become entirely ready for our defects to be removed. As I see it, the answer lies in attitude. As we look at our behaviors from step 4 we become **willing** to act differently (doesn't mean we can or will). We need to see ourselves as we want to be. There is a prayer I often say (daily), and it goes something like this: *'higher power, please remove all the character defects that no longer serve you. Thy will be done'*.

We turn to our higher power to reach the depths of our being to transform us in ways that our conscious mind cannot. I have found the long way around is the only shortcut. The keys to success are time, willingness, simplicity and always remembering we are merely wonderfully flawed human beings. Treat yourself and others with kindness. Hold true to your values as you regain them and continue loving yourself. *Keep Coming Back, You Will Get Better.*
