#### **SALT RIVER INTERGROUP**

Hello everyone, February and March were very busy for me in A.A. service and life issues. I had hoped to report on my attendance at PRAASA (Pacific Region of Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly) in Los Angeles in March, but I couldn't get it done in time. So, I'll combine my report on PRAASA, the 03 Area Assembly in Tucson Az and the District 08 DCM meeting as I as your Salt River Intergroup Liaison.

PRAASA March 3,4 & 5 2023 (Los Angeles): "The purpose of PRAASA is to develop greater unity among the members, groups, and areas of the Pacific Region; to encourage the exchange of ideas and experiences, and to provide an opportunity for members to discuss pertinent aspects of A.A. The Assembly and the PRAASA committee should always foster the Recovery, Unity, and Service legacies of A.A."

It was a remarkably busy weekend agenda packed with thoughtful, relevant to A.A. as a whole panel topics, roundtable discussions, open mic sessions, a delegate ask it basket, Trustee participation and much more. Speaking with other intergroup reps a couple of common issues discussed were, A) Adjusting to virtual participation and what that can look like in member/group representation and the fiscal impact. B) Open service positions being filled at a slower rate than before COVID, especially in person commitments.

Some of the main takeaways I received from the assembly were:

Thoughtful, courteous, well-informed discourse is healthy for our fellowship. We can have Unity even in discourse.

Social Media and virtual participation. Explore the relationship to the upside-down triangle and how that will emerge in practice and representation in A.A.'s service structure.

Arizona 03 officers who presented were outstanding and there was a good attendance from Arizona. We have thoughtful, well-informed leadership.

GSO is short their Prudent reserve. A committee has been formed to <u>explore</u> the possibility of moving out of New York when their lease is up.

The General Service Board requested the resignation of the General Service Board Chair. More information will be coming through your GSR and DCM.

Area 03 Assembly March 31-April 2nd 2023 (Tucson): As your SRI Liaison, I am currently assigned to the Treatment and Accessibility panel. It was a great panel and we finished discussion, sense of the panel or vote of all our agenda items. Some of the main takeaways I received from the assembly were:

Like PRAASA, there was courteous, thoughtful, well-informed discussion and discourse. I witnessed unity in action. Regarding the forced General Service Board Chair resignation, Kathy R, our Area 03 delegate assured us we will know more when she knows. All 93 north America delegates have had good access to the board to find out why such an unprecedented move was taken. Your group GSR or DCM is the main source for up-to-date information.

The all-panel topic of continuing with the plain language Big Book translation seemed the most talked about. My take was that all but one panel was not for continuation of the translation and the panel that voted for continuation, had an extremely close margin in favor.

Tina M was voted in as Area 03 Treasurer and steps have been implemented so there is more than one signer on Area 03 bank accounts.

Maricopa County, District 08 DCM Meeting: I attended the March meeting and announced the upcoming SRI sponsored celebration marking 80 years of A.A. in the Valley of the Sun, how to register on the SRI website and the need for service on the committee.

There were three motions about budget and finance that all passed that I'm paraphrasing as: 1) Sending money over prudent reserve to Area 03 or any other A.A. entity. 2) Travel reimbursement for DCMC and Alt DCMC will now align with Area officer expense guidelines. 3) Budget Committee will now present the budget to MCSM in October annually. #### **Tradition Five**

I must admit my favorite part in the 12 & 12, Tradition Five chapter is when one <u>sober</u> alcoholic tells a <u>suffering</u> one, "I think you're a conceited Irishman who thinks he can run the whole show". The laughter of relief may abound for us all over this, but it's only because the principles that lie behind the steps have been and continue to be worked, one day at a time. The principles behind the steps, in action, are the messages I hear in the rooms. The messages that continually reveal more about me, to me. The transformation in spiritual thinking that influences my action, relieves my suffering. The suffering I don't have to drink over, just for today.

#### **Tradition Five Checklist**

Each group has but one primary purpose- to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

Do I ever cop out by saying, "I'm not a group, so this or that Tradition doesn't apply to me"?

Am I willing to explain firmly to a newcomer the limitations of AA help, even if he gets mad at me for not giving him a loan?

Have I today imposed on any AA member for a special favor or consideration simply because I am a follow alcoholic?

Am I willing to twelfth-step the next newcomer without regard to who or what is in it for me?

Do I remember that AA old-timers, too, can be alcoholics who still suffer? Do I try both to help them and to learn from them?



#### **Concept Five**

"Throughout our world services structure, a traditional "Right of Appeal" ought to prevail, thus assuring us that minority opinion will be heard and that petitions for the redress of personal grievances will be carefully considered."

This concept focuses on the "Right of Appeal." During a vote, even if there is a "substantial unanimity" the minority opinion has a right to be heard and their grievances considered. There are times where the minority opinion is so compelling that the conference delegates change their positions and votes. For example, commonly, a minority opinion is based on the wording of the original motion. Voicing this then causing that motion to fail and allowing for the re-worded motion to pass. 
