#### **Tradition 9**

AA, as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.

"When Tradition Nine was first written, it said that 'Alcoholics Anonymous needs the least possible organization.' In years since then, we have changed our minds about that. Today, we are able to say... that Alcoholics Anonymous – AA as a whole – should never be organized at all.... How, then, can we have an unorganized movement which can and does create a service organization for itself?" And, "Did anyone ever hear of a society which couldn't somehow discipline its members and enforce obedience to necessary rules and regulations?"

"You might think A.A.'s Headquarters in New York would be an exception. Surely, the people there would have to have some authority. But long ago, trustees and staff members alike found they could do no more than make suggestions, and very mild ones at that."

"Since so many alcoholics rebel against authority..., we just dispense with it altogether. The first seven words of Tradition Nine say that we have no bosses – echoing Tradition Two [and Tradition Four]. But the last 14 words describe the system and orderliness necessary for our outfit to get things done." Things that enable us to carry the message of recovery, like a 24-hour phone answering service, meeting guides, newcomer packets, and special events, require commitment and organization on some level. So boards or committees can be created to provide a voluntary planning and operating service for its constituents – the A.A. Groups.

And who runs these boards or committees? Most anyone and no one. Positions may be filled by elections or volunteering, and are never meant to be permanent. "Rotation is not spelled out in any Step or Tradition.... But it mercifully helps solve the seniority problem..." Thankfully, Tradition Nine allows us freedom from hierarchy, governance and authority while, at the same time, holding us responsible to do our very best to realize Tradition Five.

Good service leaders, together with sound and appropriate methods of choosing them, are at all levels indispensable for our future functioning and safety. The primary world service leadership once exercised by the founders of A.A. must necessarily be assumed by the Trustees of the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous.

This concept addresses the importance of being and electing good service leaders. "Due to A.A.'s principle of rotation, furnishing our service structure with able and willing workers has to be a continuous effort." It is essential that our leaders act *for* AA and not "boss" it's members. This often requires our leaders to acknowledgement that good ideas can come from anyone and anywhere. Consequently, good leadership often needs to discard their own ideals and implement a plan that takes AA in a seemingly better direction. Therefore, when it comes to AA's elected leaders, willingness and open-mindedness are vital. Both allow for cheerful compromise and enable progress. Taken from September, 2018 Filing Cabinet

#### Eligibility & Duties:

Chairperson: Five (5) years of continuous sobriety. Term is 1 year.

- preside at all meetings of the Steering Committee and the Intergroup;
- see that all decisions and resolutions of the Steering Committee and Intergroup are carried out:
- execute, in the name of the Intergroup, all contracts and other documents affecting
  the Intergroup with of approval of a quorum of the Steering Committee and/or the
  Intergroup via email or monthly meeting;
- appoint, subject to the confirmation of the Steering Committee at the next regularly scheduled Steering Committee meeting, all Event Chairpersons, and all Chairpersons of Standing Committees;
- create ad hoc committees to carry out special projects of a short term nature, and may appoint, subject to the confirmation of the Steering committee, the Chairpersons of such committees:
- be the spokesperson for the Intergroup in all public matters and issues;
- has general oversight responsibility for the proper and effective conduct of all committees, and may recommend removal of any Chairperson from any Committee or Event to the Steering Committee; and,
- Appoint a Parliamentarian for the Intergroup meeting in the absence of the Immediate Past Chairperson.

Vice-Chairperson: Five (5) years of continuous sobriety. Term is 1 year.

- serve as the Liaison to the Area Assemblies; and,
- Perform such other duties as may from time to time be prescribed by the Chairperson or the Steering Committee.

Secretary: Three (3) years of continuous sobriety. Term is 2 years.

- keep and publish the minutes of all Steering Committee and Intergroup meetings;
- perform all other duties appropriate to the position of a corporate secretary, and such other duties as may be prescribed from time to time by the Chairperson or the Steering Committee; and,
- act as presiding Chairperson of any Steering Committee or Intergroup meetings in the absence of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Treasurer.

Advisor: Three (3) years of continuous sobriety. Term is 2 years.

- attend and participate in Steering Committee meetings;
- attend the Intergroup meetings; and,
- perform such other duties as may be prescribed from time to time by the Chairperson or Steering Committee.

In order for an Intergroup rep to vote in the November elections they, or their substitute, must attend 3 out of 5 Intergroup meetings starting in June through October.
