Tradition 10

Alcoholics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the AA name ought never be drawn into public controversy.

From the beginning, AA recognized that in order to maintain singleness of purpose, the fellowship would need to focus on helping other alcoholics recover. That would mean not engaging in outside issues that could dissuade someone from wanting to participate in the AA way of life. The spirit of Tradition 10 allows for private members to have their own relationships with outside issues but that those issues must be left outside of the meeting rooms of AA. One of the earliest examples of a program of recovery that failed due to taking part in outside issues was the Washingtonians. Due to their fragmentation over a variety of political and social issues at the time, the fellowship fell apart.

What Tradition 10 means for meetings and individuals is that their participation in outside issues should be kept outside of the meeting rooms. Members should also avoid discussing such topics during the meeting itself. If a meeting drifts off topic, it becomes the responsibility of the chairperson or home group members to guide the conversation back to our singleness of purpose. This also includes limiting flyers and pamphlets to AA related events and activities in order to avoid the appearance of endorsing something as a fellowship.

Question: Do I ever give the impression that there really is an “AA opinion” on doctors? Psychiatrists? Churches? Hospitals? Jails? Alcohol? Prescribed medications? Other drugs? Other 12 step programs? Vitamins? Al-Anon? The federal or state government?

Concept 10

Every service responsibility should be matched by an equal service authority — the scope of such authority to be always well defined whether by tradition, by resolution, by specific job description or by appropriate charters and bylaws.

Our service structure requires that each operational responsibility is granted the corresponding authority, so it may function effectively. Remember, Concept I establishes that this services structure is rooted in delegation from AA groups. Once a person assumes a role within the service structure, that person needs authority to carry out his/her duties.

Bill W. warned against withholding such authority when he stated “...when *delegated authority is operating well, it should not be constantly interfered with. [Otherwise]those charged with operating responsibly will be demoralized.*” In consideration of this, AA has implemented multiple procedural safeguards that allow for corrections and reorganization. For instance; although trusted servants have authority to do their work and achieve their responsibilities, that said authority is clearly defined,it is rarely the final authority, and it does not go unchecked.

Question: Why is delegation of “authority” so important to the overall effectiveness of A.A.? Do we use the concept to define the scope of “authority”?
