**Tradition Nine:** AA, as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.

Tradition Nine stands in contrast to the structure that exists in most organizational structures. It allows AA to operate in a “functional anarchy.” No one member or group is in charge of any other member or group. There are no hard and fast rules, merely suggestions given from one member (or group of members) to another. Since the majority of the work in AA is done via voluntary service it implies that one is assuming responsibility but not putting themselves in the position of authority. Tradition Nine also indicates the need for the spirit of rotation in order to ensure members not trying to take on assumed authority and to allow others to practice their 12<sup>th</sup> step service work to the fellowship.

Bill W drew from the experience of the Oxford Group with the development of the Ninth Tradition. He saw the Oxford Group disintegrate when the leader took too much authority and struggled to correct mistakes he made with his leadership. Bill knew that AA needed to be protected in order for it to survive and that some members may attempt to take too much control or try to assume authority and end up being the downfall of the fellowship.

Question: Am I aware of all those to whom I am responsible in any AA job?

**Concept nine:** Good service leaders, together with sound and appropriate methods of choosing them, are at all levels indispensable for our future functioning and safety. The primary world service leadership once exercised by the founders of A.A. must necessarily be assumed by the Trustees of the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous.

This concept addresses the importance of being and electing good service leaders. “Due to A.A.’s principle of rotation, furnishing our service structure with able and willing workers has to be a continuous effort.” It is essential that our leaders act for AA and not “boss” it’s members. This often requires our leaders to acknowledge that good ideas can come from anyone and anywhere. Consequently, good leadership often needs to discard their own ideals and implement a plan that takes AA in a seemingly better direction. Therefore, when it comes to AA’s elected leaders, willingness and open-mindedness are vital. Both allow for cheerful compromise and enable progress.

## Salt River Intergroup

Has positions open for the Steering Committee. Elections are being held at the November Intergroup meeting. Elections will be held for the positions of Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary, and 2 Advisors.

### Eligibility & Duties:

Chairperson: Five (5) years of continuous sobriety. Term is 1 year.

- preside at all meetings of the Steering Committee and the Intergroup;
- see that all decisions and resolutions of the Steering Committee and Intergroup are carried out;
- execute, in the name of the Intergroup, all contracts and other documents affecting the Intergroup with of approval of a quorum of the Steering Committee and/or the Intergroup via email or monthly meeting;
- appoint, subject to the confirmation of the Steering Committee at the next regularly scheduled Steering Committee meeting, all Event Chairpersons, and all Chairpersons of Standing Committees;
- create ad hoc committees to carry out special projects of a short term nature, and may appoint, subject to the confirmation of the Steering committee, the Chairpersons of such committees;
- be the spokesperson for the Intergroup in all public matters and issues;
- has general oversight responsibility for the proper and effective conduct of all committees, and may recommend removal of any Chairperson from any Committee or Event to the Steering Committee; and,
- Appoint a Parliamentarian for the Intergroup meeting in the absence of the Immediate Past Chairperson.

Vice-Chairperson: Five (5) years of continuous sobriety. Term is 1 year.

- chair the Steering Committee meetings and Intergroup meetings in the absence of the Chairperson;
- serve as the Liaison to the Area Assemblies; and,
- Perform such other duties as may from time to time be prescribed by the Chairperson or the Steering Committee.

Secretary: Three (3) years of continuous sobriety. Term is 2 years.

- keep and publish the minutes of all Steering Committee and Intergroup meetings;
- perform all other duties appropriate to the position of a corporate secretary, and such other duties as may be prescribed from time to time by the Chairperson or the Steering Committee; and,
- act as presiding Chairperson of any Steering Committee or Intergroup meetings in the absence of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Treasurer.

Advisor: Three (3) years of continuous sobriety. Term is 2 years.

- attend and participate in Steering Committee meetings;
- attend the Intergroup meetings; and,
- perform such other duties as may be prescribed from time to time by the Chairperson or Steering Committee.

In order for an Intergroup rep to vote in the November elections they, or their substitute, must attend 3 out of 5 Intergroup meetings starting in June through October.

During the October Intergroup Meeting all nominations will be announced along with information about each candidate. Floor nominations may be made at this time.

The eligible Intergroup Reps will take back to their home groups the candidate information and they will vote for each position. The Intergroup rep will bring back this vote and cast it on the November ballot.

Changes to the candidates CANNOT take place after the October meeting. If a change must be made the elections will be postponed until December so during the November Intergroup Meeting the revised candidate list can be presented to all Intergroup reps who will again take this back to their home groups.

Elections are held at the November Intergroup Meeting unless postponed by vote.

## AA Service Resume for Quianna B.
