From Your Steering Committee

Tradition Twelve

Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

What is anonymity? According to the dictionary it is “the quality or state of being unknown to most people”. The two words referenced in the Twelfth Tradition as it relates to anonymity are sacrifice and humility. Sacrifice is the act of giving something up and humility is a modest or low view of one’s importance. The definition of humility that I really like is that I don’t think less of myself...I think of myself less.

All of this is attached to our spiritual foundation. It is interesting when I looked up the definitions of sacrifice and humility the definitions referred to a deity... a Higher Power or God. Humility can mean a recognition of self in relation to God. Sacrifice can be described as an act of offering something precious to a God.

This Tradition reminds me to place principals before personalities. For me the principals are the Traditions...common welfare, unity, God as the ultimate authority, a desire to stop drinking, carrying the message, self supporting, attraction not promotion, anonymity, humility and sacrifice.

There is not one single person that is more important than any other in AA. I am a flawed human being, perfect in God’s eyes only. I can and will make mistakes. I do not want them to be associated with the world’s opinion of Alcoholics Anonymous...and so I remain anonymous. There are two kinds of business...my business and none of my business...and so I protect the anonymity of others. I am willing to surrender my personal desires for the opportunity to fit my will to God’s will thereby building a spiritual foundation that puts principals above personalities.

Question: What does “principals before personalities” mean to me?

Tradition Twelve Checklist

Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

- Why is it a good idea for me to place the common welfare of all AA members before individual welfare? What would happen to me if AA as a whole disappeared?
- When I do not trust AA’s current servants, who do I wish had the authority to straighten them out?
- In my opinions of and remarks about AAs, am I implying membership requirements other than a desire to stay sober?
- Do I ever try to get certain AA group to conform to my standards, not its own?
- Have I a personal responsibility in helping an AA group fulfill its primary purpose? What is my part?
- Does my personal behavior reflect the Sixth Tradition – or belie it?
- Do I do all I can do to support AA financially? When is the last time I anonymously gave away a Grapevine subscription?
- Do I complain about certain AA’s behavior – especially if they are paid to work for AA? Who made me so smart?
- Do I fulfill all AA responsibilities in such a way as to please privately even my own conscience? Really?
- Do my utterances always reflect the Tenth Tradition, or do I give AA critics real ammunition?
- Should I keep my AA membership a secret, or reveal it in private conversation when that may help another alcoholic (and therefore me)? Is my brand of AA so attractive that other drunks want it?
- What is my real importance among more than a million AAs?



Concept Twelve

This Concept consists of the 12 General Warranties of the General Service Conference. Simply looking to the meaning of the word “warranty” will explain a great deal about this concept. By definition, a warranty is a written guarantee that something will work in a certain way and the promise to repair or replace if necessary. Concept 12 endeavors to guarantee that the General service Conference will work in a certain way, that is, to possess qualities of prudence and spirituality.

Although the conference charter itself can be amended freely, the 12 warranties are subjected to the same amendment process of both the 12 Steps and the 12 Traditions; “written consent of three- quarters of all A.A. groups” in the world!

The 12 Warranties expresses spiritual principles and seek to hold the Conference fast to A.A as a whole.

Concept Twelve Checklist

The Conference shall observe the spirit of A.A. tradition, taking care that it never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds and reserve be its prudent financial principle; that it place none of its members in a position of unqualified authority over others; that it reach all important decisions by discussion, vote, and whenever possible, by substantial unanimity; that its actions never be personally punitive nor an incitement to public controversy; that it never perform acts of government, and that, like the Society it serves, it will always remain democratic in thought and action.

- How do we guard against becoming a “seat of perilous wealth and power”?
- How do we practice prudent use of our Seventh Tradition contributions and literature revenue?
- Do we insure the spiritual liberties of all A.A. members by not placing any member in the position of absolute authority over others?
- Do we try to reach important decisions by thorough discussion, vote and, where possible, substantial unanimity?
- As guardians of A.A.’s traditions, are we ever justified in being personally punitive?
- Are we careful to avoid public controversy?
- Do we always try to treat each other with mutual respect and love?
